Patrick Gaskin President and Chief Executive Officer

Patrick started his health administration career over 35 years ago, first working at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre in Toronto after completing a Masters in Health Administration. In his career, he has worked in both teaching and community hospitals and has spent time as a health care consultant and health planner. In 2007, he completed a fellowship through the Canadian Health Research Foundation focused on the attributes of a high performing organization. Twenty-five years ago, he and his family moved to Waterloo Region to take a role at Grand River Hospital. There he served in various capacities for 9 years – as a Vice-President, then Executive Vice-President and Regional VP for Cancer Services, and as Acting CEO for a time. During his career, Patrick has been asked to support organizations under provincial supervision 4 times. In each of these assignments, Patrick has worked with the senior leaders in improving the hospital's performance.

Patrick Gaskin joined Cambridge Memorial Hospital over 15 years ago and serves as the hospital's President and Chief Executive Officer. Patrick is married to Fiona, and they have 3 children and an English Springer Spaniel named Sable. The kids are all grown up and "off the payroll" – the dog not quite yet!

The Page Turners (Book Club #2): The Page Turners continued to meet over the summer. In June, the book discussed was *The Life Cycle of the Common Octopus* by Emma Knight. The story is set mainly in Edinburgh and is **not** about octopuses. This is a story of sexual awakening, motherhood, the shock of becoming an adult and friendship. The consensus was that this was a very good read. The July book was *Chasing Daylight: How my Forthcoming Death Transformed My Life* by Eugene O'Kelly. Written in just three and half months, the author was given a diagnosis of brain cancer and about three months to live. During that time, he took the time to do "winding up" with his colleagues, friends and family, and he wrote this memoir. Although the book is inspiring on some levels, the group felt that the author should maybe have spent more time with his family than writing a book in his last few months! The August choice was *In Winter I Get Up at Night* by well-known Canadian author Jane Urquhart. This is the "memoir" of Emer McConnell, a music teacher in rural Saskatchewan. The novel explores some of the overarching themes of the twentieth century -- colonial expansion, scientific progress and the dark forces that seek to divide societies along racial and cultural lines. A wonderful and haunting book. The September book will be *The Art Thief* by Michael Fi.

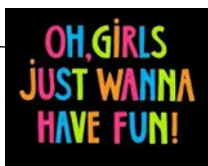

Cranberry Maple Cranberry Chutney

- 1 (12-ounce) bag frozen or fresh cranberries
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup maple syrup
- 1/2 cup finely chopped onion
- 1/2 cup (about 2 1/2 ounces) chopped crystallized ginger
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon honey Dijon-style mustard
- 1 teaspoon minced fresh garlic
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Combine all ingredients in heavy medium saucepan.

Bring to boil on medium heat, stirring frequently. Reduce heat to low. Simmer, uncovered, 10 to 15 minutes or until cranberries begin to pop and mixture thickens. Allow to cool at room temperature, then refrigerate, covered, for at least 2 hours to chill and flavors to blend.
